2. Was written by God on tables of stone. — Exodus 24:12.
3. Was placed in the Ark. — Deut. 10:5.
4. Was right true and good. — Nehemiah 9:13.
5. Was a law which if a man does, he shall even live in them. — Ezekiel 20:11, 13, 21.
6. Is a perfect law. — Ps. 19:7.
7. Christ did not come to destroy. — Mathew 5:17.
8. He came to magnify and make it honorable. — Isaiah 42:21.
9. Not one jot or tittle shall pass away, till all be fulfilled. — Matt. 5:18.
10. We must not break the least. — Matt. 5:19.
11. Is a law of liberty. — James 2:12.
12. Is established through faith in Christ. — Rom. 3:31.
13. Is spiritual. — Romans 7:14.
14. Is holy and good. — Romans 7:12.
15. Was written by the finger of God and called the royal law. — Exodus 31:18; James 2:8.
16. Was proclaimed by Jehovah himself, and he added no more. — Deut. 5:22.
17. And are the commandments of God brought to light in the Third Angel's Message of Rev. 14:12, and which will insure to those who observe them, a right to the tree of life. — Rev. 22:14.

17. Is the law of Commandments contained in ordinances (Eph. 2:15). A shadow of good things to come (Heb. 10:1), and was disannulled for the unprofitableness thereof. — Heb. 7:18; Heb. 10:3.
